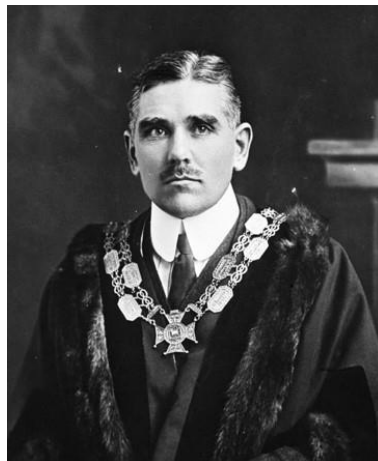

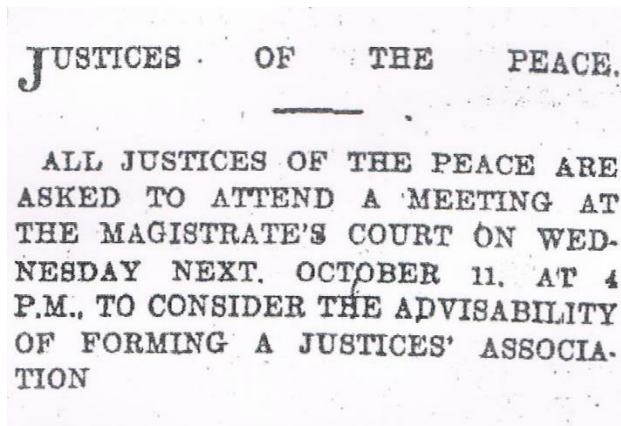

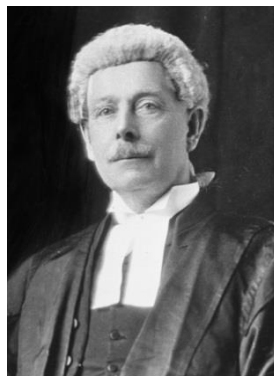
+ 11th October – Auckland Justices of the Peace meet and decide to form an Association

+ 18th October – the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) is founded

+ 25th October – a meeting formally establishes the Auckland Association of Justices of the Peace
